Port Washington Lions Club 48th “Lions Fest / Fish Derby”

FISHING BOUNDARIES

There is **No fishing allowed in the power plant enclosed retaining pond off Coal Dock Park. Boundaries to the north and south will be parallel with the Ozaukee County lines.** The Port Washington Lions Club is a non-profit organization and hopes all contestants follow the spirit of the rules.

CONTEST RULES

- 1.) Each Contestant entering the Port Washington Lions Club Fishing Derby automatically agrees to abide by all rules of the Derby and the laws of the State of Wisconsin pertaining to fishing in Lake Michigan waters.
- 2.) **The 2022 Derby begins Saturday July 30th starting at 12:01 AM ending at (noon) 12pm Sunday July 31st**
- 3.) \$25 entry ticket sales will cease at 5am Saturday. Tickets will be available for sale at the Lions Festival tent prior to the deadline. Advanced Mail orders must be postmarked by July 18, 2022. Payout remains the same as last year. The Lions club will keep \$5 per ticket (20%) paying out 80% of all ticket sales. Grand Prize is 35%, each remaining 1st place will split 35%, 2nd place splits 20% and 3rd place splits 10%.
- 4.) **A \$25 ticket per angler is required, (NOT one per boat). Each ticket is valid for both days.**
- 5.) To enter a fish in the Derby, the contestant must have purchased their ticket before catching the fish. To be eligible to win a door prize, each ticket holder must register at least one fish per ticket number.
- 6.) Each entrant must have a valid Wisconsin Fishing License and a Great Lakes Salmon stamp. Under Wisconsin law anyone under 15 years of age or younger is not required to purchase a fishing license.
- 7.) All fish entered must be **registered (weighed in) at the PW Lions Tent located at new Fish Cleaning Station.** No frozen or discolored fish will be accepted.
- 8.) **Fish will be judged by weight / species.** Lion's judges and/or the Wisconsin DNR / Fish & Wildlife will make all determinations as to the species and weight, and their decisions will be final in all cases. **In the event of a tie weight for a prize, the FIRST FISH REGISTERED by time will be eligible for that prize.**
- 9.) **Registration hours:** Saturday 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM and Sunday 6am till 12pm. Anglers in line to register fish at noon will be allowed to register their fish and will be eligible for prizes. Anglers entering the line after 12 PM noon Sunday will NOT be able to register their fish.
- 10.) Winners need not be present to win. All **First-Place fish will be displayed for the public.**
- 11.) The PWLC assumes no responsibility or liability for any accident or injury to anyone participating in the Port Washington Lions Club Fishing Derby, nor any liability for any lost or stolen articles during this event.

An additional prize will be awarded for any new Derby record fish caught by a registrant during the event.

PRIZES AND CONTEST GRAND PRIZE

awarded about 12:30pm Sunday on the main Stage in Lower Lake Park

The Grand Prize of about \$1,200 Cash* will be awarded from a drawing of the winners of the largest fish, by weight, caught and weighed during the Derby in our categories. The Grand Prize winner will NOT receive the First place Category Cash Prize.

CATEGORY PRIZES

Prizes of about \$300 Cash* will be given for the largest fish (by weight) caught in each of the remaining 4 species categories. About \$200 Cash* will be awarded for each 2nd Place. About \$75 Cash* for 3rd place in each of the five categories. * (Based on number of tickets sold, with the average per year being 175)

CONFIRMATION OF ELIGIBILITY

The Port Washington Lions Club reserves the right to confirm contestant's eligibility by internal inspection (gutting) of all prize-winning entries.
